ANKARA - Turkey hopes the Upper Karabakh issue between Azerbaijan and Armenia will be resolved urgently within the scope of UN resolutions, President Recep Tayyip Erdogan on Wednesday. During a joint news

MOSCOW - Russia has started production of the S-400 air defense system for Turkey, head of the Russian manufacturing company, Rosoboronexport, said on Wednesday. "We have started to execute the contract. We are not talking about the deliveries of S-400, the production of the air defense system has started," Rosoboronexport General Director Alexandre

Miheev said in Turkey's resort city of Antalya, according to the state-controlled news agency, RIA Novosti. Last December, Turkey announced it had concluded an agreement with Russia for the purchase of two S-400 systems by late 2019. On April 3, Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin said in Ankara that they had agreed to shorten the... **MORE DETAILS**

Turkey faces 'wave' of Afghan migrants

ADANA - Undocumented migrants from Afghanistan to Turkey have been on the rise in recent months, Turkish interior minister said on Wednesday. "We have been facing in recent months a wave of migrants, especially from Afghanistan," Suleyman Soylu said during his address to immigration

officials in southern Adana province. "Among the illegal migrants in 2018, [a total of] 29,899 people are of Afghan origin. The total number of illegal Afghan migrants in 2017 was 45,259 people," Soylu added. The interior minister said Turkey arrested... **MORE DETAILS**



Over 300 receive jail sentence over FETO links

KONYA - A court in the central Konya province on Wednesday handed down jail sentences to 342 people linked to the Fetullah Terrorist Organization (FETO), for their involvement in the July 2016 defeated coup. FETO and its U.S.-based leader Fetullah Gulen orchestrated the defeated coup on July 15, 2016, that martyred 250 people and injured nearly 2,200 others. Ankara also accuses FETO of

being behind a long-running campaign to overthrow the state through the infiltration of Turkish institutions, particularly the military, police, and judiciary. The 9th Criminal Court convicted 332 out of 478 suspects of being members of an armed terrorist organization, a source, who asked not to be named due to restrictions on speaking to the media, said.
