## Israel intentionally targeted unarmed protesters



13,000 Palestinians injured – 3,500 by live ammo – since Gaza demos began on Mar. 30, UN official says

GAZA CITY - Israel intentionally targeted Palestinian protesters near the Gaza-Israel security fence last week, Pierre Krahenbuhl, head of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA), said Tuesday. Speaking at a press conference in Gaza City, Krahenbuhl described the nature of injuries sustained by Palestinian protesters as "shocking". Krahenbuhl said the Israeli army had deliberately targeted protesters' lower

limbs, knees, backs and heads.

He added that the number of protesters injured since Palestinians began holding rallies near the Gaza-Israel fence on Mar. 30 now exceeded the number of those injured during Israel's destructive 2014 military onslaught on the coastal enclave.

Israel's 2014 offensive left more than 2,250 Palestinians dead and thousands more injured -- mostly civilians -while leaving much of Gaza's infrastructure in ruins. Of the 13,000 Palestinians injured since... MORE DETAILS

#### Turkey calls for abolishing health restrictions on Gaza

GENEVA - Turkey on Tuesday urged the World Health Organization and other UN agencies to take measures to stop restrictions on the movement of patients, health staff and essential medicines in the besieged Gaza Strip. "People in the occupied Palestine territory are in dire need of medicines, medical equipment and beds," Turkish Health Ministry Undersecretary Eyup Gumus said on Tuesday at the World

Health Organization's (WHO's) 71st annual World Health Assembly in Geneva.

Noting the recent Israeli attacks which killed scores of people and injured about 3,000 people within the last week, Gumus said: "The restrictions imposed on the movement of patients, health staff, essential medicine and medical consumables have hindered the functioning of health system. "These restrictions are illegal, inhumane and unacceptable. MORE DETAILS

RAMALLAH - Palestinian Foreign Minister Riyad al-Malki on Tuesday requested the International Criminal Court (ICC) to investigate Israel's settlement building and alleged war crimes. Al-Malki has submitted a so-called "referral" to the Office of the ICC Prosecutor in The Hague to start

an investigation into "Israel's settlements and war crimes in the Palestinian territories", according to a statement by the Palestinian Foreign Ministry. #### Turkey-Afghanistan air trade corridor opens

KABUL - Turkey and Afghanistan on Tuesday launched an air corridor to boost bilateral trade. Afghanistan's Minister of Industry and Commerce Humayoon Rasaw, Minister of Agriculture Nasir Ahmad Durrani, Turkish Ambassador to Kabul Oguzhan Ertugrul and Turkey's flag carrier Turkish Airlines Kabul manager, Ahmet Uludag attended the opening ceremony at Hamid Karzai

International Airport. Speaking at the event, Rasaw said Afghanistan wants to increase trade cooperation with Turkey and that his country will provide convenience to Turkish businesspeople.
