Unemployment falls in April

Unemployment rate in April records annual decline of 0.9 percentage points, according to TurkStat

ANKARA - Turkey's unemployment rate fell to 9.6 percent in April, dropping 0.9 percentage points year-on-year, the country's statistical authority announced on Monday. TurkStat said the number of unemployed persons aged 15 years and over declined by some 200,000 on a yearly basis, amounting to 3.08 million in

"In the same period, nonagricultural unemployment rate occurred as 11.4 percent with one percentage point decrease," the institute said.

"While youth unemployment rate, including persons aged 15-24 was 16.9 percent with 2.9 percentage point decrease, the unemployment rate for persons aged 15-64 occurred as 9.8 percent with 0.9 percentage point decrease," it added. TurkStat noted that the number of employed people rose by some 850,000 to around 29 million over the same period, taking the employment rate to 47.9 percent with a 0.7-percentage point annual increase.

Anadolu Agency shoots aerial footage of FETO camp in US

WASHINGTON - Anadolu Agency on Sunday captured aerial footage of the camp where Fetullah Terrorist Organization (FETO) leader Fetullah Gulen lives in Pennslyvania's Saylorsburg village in the U.S. Anadolu Agency flew above the

quiet compound where the terror leader has resided since 1999 and took photos and video of the camp out of a helicopter.

Sunday marked the second anniversary of a deadly coup attempt staged by FETO in Turkey on July 15, 2016, which left 251 people martyred and nearly 2,200 injured. Ankara also accuses FETO of being behind a long-running

campaign to overthrow the state through the infiltration of Turkish institutions, particularly the military, police, and judiciary. Several FETO members, who were wandering inside the camp, were spotted hiding their faces with newspapers while Anadolu Agency was filming the area.

The area is home to one main building where Gulen meets the members of the organization and nine separate residences.

The entrance, strengthened with security surveillance, greets members with a signboard Golden Generation Chestnut Camp Retreat Center written on it.

'End of emergency rule not to deter anti-terror fight'

ISTANBUL - Turkey's state of emergency enforced in the wake of the defeated 2016 coup attempt will be lifted in a few days, but the struggle against terrorism will continue, Justice Minister Abdulhamit Gul said on Monday.

Speaking at the International Struggle Against Coup and 15 July Symposium, Gul said: "The state of emergency will end, but the most persistent and most determined fight

ANKARA - A Turkish Foreign Ministry official on Monday dismissed a news report claiming complete withdrawal of PYD/YPG terrorist organization from Syria's northeastern Manbij city. "We find it exaggerated the news claiming PYD/ YPG has fully withdrawn from Manbij," said the official, who asked not to be named due to restrictions on speaking to the media. The official said the process is ongoing, referring to patrols conducted in the region by Turkish and the U.S. troops separately, which started on June 18. A deal was reached between Ankara and Washington in early June, which focused on the withdrawal of the YPG terror group from the city in order to stabilize the region. The PYD/YPG is the Syrian branch of the PKK terror

group, which has waged a campaign against Turkey for over a decade resulting in the death of 40,000 people, including women and children. "Withdrawal from the control zones on the patrol
