

Imran Khan elected as Pakistan's premier

KARACHI - Imran Khan, the country's former cricket star, was elected as prime minister on Friday by Pakistan's lower house, the National Assembly.

Khan, 66, whose center-right Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) emerged as the single largest party in the July 25 general election, won 176 out of 272 votes cast by parliamentarians. Shehbaz Sharif, his only contender and three-

time chief minister of the country's largest Punjab province, could amass 96

PTI lawmakers thumped their desks and chanted slogans in favor of Khan, as soon as National Assembly Speaker Asad Qaiser announced the verdict.

The opposition members, mainly from Sharif's Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz party, raised slogans against alleged rigging in the election.
