Russian fighter jets hit targets in Idlib

Warplanes target residential areas and opposition frontlines, local sources say


IDLIB - Russian warplanes have been hitting targets at many civilian residential areas and the frontlines of the opposition in Syria's northwestern Idlib province. According to local sources, the fighter jets attacked west of Idlib and north of Hama on Tuesday noon. The sources said the warplanes hit civilian

residential areas in Jisr al-Shughur City; areas of Basangul, Ghani, Innab, Sirmaniyah, west of Idlib; Zayzun area, north of Hama; as well as the opposition's frontlines. According to a Syrian opposition aircraft observatory, so far a total of 20 attacks were carried out by three Russian warplanes,


which took off from Hmeimim airbase. As the attacks continue, the number of casualties are unknown.

- In May, Idlib was designated a "de-escalation zone" -- in which acts of aggression are expressly forbidden -- as part of ongoing peace talks in Kazakh capital Astana

US 'repeating Churchill's bungles'

ANKARA - The Trump administration's diplomatic row with Turkey is reminiscent of former British Prime Minister Winston Churchill's "bungles" during World War I which resulted in the Ottoman Empire joining the war on the side of Imperial Germany, according to a U.S. expert.
