Turkish president says country struggling against all issues affecting economy within free market system

## Central Bank hikes interest rates

ANKARA - Turkish Central Bank on Thursday hiked its one-week repo rate by 625 base points.

In a statement, the bank's Monetary Policy Committee said the policy rate was increased to 24 percent, up from 17.75 percent.

According to Anadolu Agency's survey on Monday, a group of 17 economists expected a rise in one-week repo rate with a median of 425 base points, i.e. 4.25 percentage points. The next two Monetary Policy Committee meetings are to be held on Oct. 25, and

ANKARA - President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said Thursday Turkey will take further action to prevent fluctuation in foreign exchange rates. Speaking at a meeting of the Confederation of Turkish Tradesmen and Craftsmen (TESK) in Ankara, Erdogan said the country is struggling against all issues affecting the Turkish economy without getting outside the boundaries of the free market system. "We are well aware that

some other countries that had faced similar problems have solved those problems in a way that does not fit with the definition of a free market economy," Erdogan said. "However, we did not resort to such ways in the past, and will not [do it in the future]," he

added.

#### Israel demolishes village in East Jerusalem

KHAN AL-AHMAR - Israel on Thursday razed a symbolic "village" in East Jerusalem erected earlier by Palestinian activists to protest an Israeli plan to demolish Khan al-Ahmar, a nearby Bedouin hamlet.

"An Israeli army force stormed the symbolic village before demolishing it," Walid Assaf, head of an anti-settlement commission affiliated with the Palestine

Liberation Organization, told Anadolu Agency.

The Israeli force, Assaf said, had since cordoned off the area, designating it a "military zone".
