Syria summit to be held in Istanbul

ANKARA - A quadrilateral summit on Syria between Turkey, Russia, Germany and France will be held in Istanbul on Oct. 27, Turkish presidential spokesman Ibrahim Kalin said on Friday. The meeting, which will be hosted by Turkish President

Recep Tayyip Erdogan, will see the participation of Russian President Vladimir Putin, German Chancellor Angela Merkel and French President Emmanuel Macron. ANKARA - Turkey "makes life miserable" for terrorists anywhere in the world, President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said on Friday. "While we had difficulties to struggle with terrorists even within our borders until recently, today we make life miserable for terrorists anywhere in the world from Iraq to Syria, from Europe to Central Asia," Erdogan said at the opening ceremony for the new academic year at Dokuz Eylul University

in western Izmir province. Also mentioning Turkey's humanitarian efforts, Erdogan said Turkey gains world's appreciation with its humanitarian stance, along with its cross-border operations to protect the country's security. Bosnia commemorates 1st President Izetbegovic

BELGRADE - Friday marks the 15th death anniversary of Alija Izetbegovic, independent Bosnia's first president and a pivotal figure in the troubled history of the Balkans. Izetbegovic -- a politician, writer and lawyer who came to international prominence during the country's bitter 1992-1995 war -- is commemorated every year

on his death anniversary. Often dubbed the "Wise King", Izetbegovic managed to gain independence for his country on March 1, 1992 - months after Slovenia and Croatia broke away from the former Yugoslavia. Izetbegovic died in Sarajevo on Oct. 19, 2003 of natural causes, having served as president of the Republic of Bosnia-Herzegovina from 1992 to 1996 and as chairman of... [MORE DETAILS](#)
