Turkish FM: Saudi remarks on Khashoggi 'unsatisfying'

ANKARA - Turkey is "unsatisfied" by the statements made by Saudi Arabia's chief prosecutor's office on the killing of Saudi journalist Jamal Khashoggi, the country's foreign minister said on Thursday. "I want to say that I find some explanations [of the prosecutor's office] unsatisfying," Mevlut Cavusoglu said at a conference held in the Mediterranean resort town of Alanya in southern Antalya province. "We find the steps taken positive but inadequate," he added. The foreign minister's remarks come shortly after Saudi Arabia's chief

prosecutor's office announced it had charged 11 out of 21 suspects in relation to the killing of Khashoggi. Cavusoglu urged Saudi authorities to reveal the instructors behind the killing of Khashoggi in order to close the process of the Khashoggi case. The foreign minister further asserted that the main question which remains unanswered is where the body of Khashoggi is, adding: "There is so far no answer on this matter". He added that Turkey will continue to closely follow the issue. Firm stance on Cyprus, Syria, Libya to continue

LEFKOSA - Turkey's vice president said Thursday that the country will continue its "righteous and firm" stance on Cyprus, Syria and Libya. Speaking at a ceremony marking the 35th foundation anniversary of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), Fuat Oktay said the reason for Cyprus still not reaching solution is the irreconcilable attitude of Greek Cypriots who have adopted insolubility as a maxim. "Turkey will continue to

display its righteous and firm stance with determination in Cyprus, Syria and Libya," Oktay said. Oktay said TRNC is one of the two founding and equal parts of the island and Turkey will not let Greek Cypriots ignore this fact.
