ANKARA - Turkey will launch an operation in the east of Euphrates, Syria in a few days to save it from separatist terrorist organization, President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said on Wednesday. "We expressed that we will launch an operation in east of Euphrates in a few days to save it from a separatist terrorist organization," Erdogan said at the Turkish Defense Industry Summit.

Erdogan added Turkey's target has never been U.S. soldiers, but rather members of terror group.

"It is clear that the purpose of U.S. observation points [in Syria] is not to protect our country from terrorists but to protect terrorists from Turkey," Erdogan
