Turkey has no issue with Kurds, but PKK

ANKARA - Turkey does not have any issue with Kurds, the issue is the PKK terror group and its extensions in Syria, the country's presidential communications director said on Monday. "The Republic of Turkey

is not an enemy of Kurds, but a protector [of them]," Fahrettin Altun said on Twitter. Altun stressed that "national security"

was most essential for Turkev.

"Terror is terror and it must be eradicated. What Turkey doing in Syria is exactly that," he said. Altun stressed that PYD and YPG are terror organizations reiterated Turkey's determination in the fight against terrorism.

Turkey not deterred by threats, says FM

Mevlut Cavusoglu says economic threats will avail nothing, following Donald Trump saying he would 'devastate' Turkey

ANKARA - Ankara will not shrink from threats by U.S. President Donald Trump, said Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlut Cavusoglu on Monday. "We have repeatedly said that we are never afraid of threats. Threatening Turkey economically will get you nowhere," Cavusoglu told a news conference with his Luxembourg counterpart Jean Asselborn in the Turkish capital Ankara. Cavusoglu's remarks came in response to Trump's threat to attack Turkey's economy if

Ankara hits the terror group PKK/YPG during the withdrawal of U.S. troops from Syria.

"Strategic partners" should not communicate through social media, Cavusoglu added, in clear reference to the perennially tweeting U.S. leader. "[The US] Will devastate Turkey economically if they hit Kurds," Trump tweeted on Sunday, conflating "Kurds" with the terrorist PKK/YPG, a confusion that Turkey has repeatedly criticized.

Dome of the Rock shut over 'Jewish cap'

JERUSALEM - Palestinian authorities shut Jerusalem's iconic Dome of the Rock mosque on Monday after an Israeli policeman attempted to force his way into the place, according to a spokesman. "Palestinian quard closed the mosque after an Israeli policeman wearing a Jewish

cap tried to enter the worship place," Firas al-Dibs, a spokesman for Jerusalem's Jordan-run Religious Endowments Authority, said. "The guards asked the policeman to take off his cap before entering the mosque, but he refused and attempted

to force his way into the place,
