# PKK killed 27 civilians in 2018

ANKARA - The terrorist organization PKK killed 27 civilians in 2018, the Turkey's Interior Ministry said. In a statement on Wednesday, the ministry said PKK's terrorist attacks

targeted women and children as well.

The statement said that PKK terrorists killed seven civilians during Turkey's Operation Olive Branch in northern Syria, identifying them as Nadi Al Faras, Sahin Elitas, Muzaffer

# policy rate unchanged

ANKARA - The Turkish Central Bank (CBRT) on Wednesday kept its oneweek repo rate -- also known as the policy rate -- constant at 24 percent. The decision came in a statement from the bank's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting, which is the first of eight meetings

scheduled for the year. Among 19 economists surveyed by Anadolu Agency on Monday, only one economist expected a 150-base-point decline, i.e. 1.50 percentage points, in one-week repo rate, while all the others foresaw no change in interest rates. In 2018, the CBRT held nine MPC meetings, as interest rates climbed from... MORE DETAILS

### Istanbul police seize large amount of drug in op.

ISTANBUL - Some 115 kilogram of cocaine and heroin and more than half million opiate pills were seized in largescale bust in Istanbul, security source said on Wednesday.

After receiving a tip-off, anti-drug police squad conducted raid in the northernmost Sariyer

district of the city on Sunday, said the source who asked not to be named due to restrictions on speaking to the media.

A total of 47 kg (103 pounds) of cocaine was confiscated at the operation.

They also seized 68 kg (150 pounds) of heroin and 550,000 opiate pills during the raid. MORE DETAILS

### EU says risk of no-deal on Brexit imminent

Speaking at the EU parliament, Michel Barnier said: "We are fearing more than ever, that there is a risk of a no deal, and we still are focused on avoiding that scenario."
