







#### Historic Bangsamoro vote held in Philippines

COTABATO CITY - A referendum set to shape the future of Muslims in the southern Philippines has started on Monday. The Bangsamoro Muslims, long deprived of freedom under the U.S. and the modern Philippine state, reached the final phase in an autonomy agreement signed with the government in Manila in July 2018. On Monday, nearly 3 million people are voting on the Bangsamoro Organic Law (BOL) under tight security measures in Cotabato City, the regional center of Muslim the law will be... MORE DETAILS

Mindanao.

The voting started at 7.00 a.m. (2300GMT) and will conclude at 3.00 p.m. (0700GMT).

The referendum is set to grant the Bangsamoro or Moro -- a collective term for Filipino Muslims living on an island in the southern Philippines -- long-awaited comprehensive autonomy. # 'We won't let Syria safe zone become swamp'

President Erdogan says aim of safe zone inside Syria border should be to keep terror groups away from Turkey's border

ANKARA - Ankara will never allow a safe zone in Syria to be transformed into "another swamp" against Turkey, President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said on Monday.

"We can never allow an implementation of a safe zone [to be established in northern Syria] to be transformed into another swamp against our country," Erdogan said at a meeting of the Turkish Union of Chambers and Commodity Exchanges (TOBB) in the capital Ankara.

Erdogan said Ankara was not against the formation of 30-kilometer (20-mile) safe zone in northern Syria near Turkey's border, adding the aim of a safe zone should be to keep terrorist organizations away from Turkey's border. The president said Turkey has "no eye" on Syria's territorial

integrity, adding he will also discuss the issue with his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin in Moscow in the upcoming days. About a possible operation in the region east of the Euphrates River, Erdogan said almost all preparations have been completed. A mission east of the Euphrates River, which Turkey's leadership has been suggesting for months, would follow two successful crossborder Turkish operations into Syria since 2016 --**Operations Euphrates Shield** and Olive Branch -- meant to eradicate the presence of YPG/PKK and Daesh terrorists near Turkey's borders. #### Turkey ready to take over security in Manbij

ANKARA - Turkey is ready to take over the security in Syria's Manbij without delay, President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said during a phone conversation with his U.S. counterpart late Sunday.

A statement from the Turkish presidency said Erdogan and U.S. President Donald Trump agreed to take joint measures to clear Daesh's remnants in Syria and prevent the group's resurgence.

Erdogan said that Turkey will not allow PKK and its Syrian affiliate PYD/YPG to destabilize northeastern Syria. The two leaders also discussed the bilateral relations... MORE DETAILS
