Turkish, Russian leaders meet in Moscow

Putin offers Erdogan condolences over death of Turkish sailors

MOSCOW - Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin have started their first faceto-face meeting of 2019. Putin expressed his condolences to Erdogan over the death of 16 Turkish citizens, who were killed in a twin vessel fire in the Kerch Strait on Jan. 21. Putin said the incident had happened in neutral waters as one of the vessels was transferring its cargo of liquified gas to the other. "Our services reacted quickly -did everything to save the people. But it is still a great tragedy for the

families, for the victims. Please

accept our condolences," he said.

Putin also praised the development



FETO serves foreign intelligence agencies

ANKARA - The Fetullah Terrorist Organization (FETO), a group behind the 2016 defeated coup in Turkey, works with and serves the interests of Western spy agencies around the world, especially U.S. intelligence services, according to a new report. FETO and its U.S.-based leader Fetullah Gulen serve the U.S. interests in Russia, the Balkans, Eurasia, Caucasus and the Middle East, said the Turkish Police

Academy report, "FETO -An International Threat." The terror network also runs more than 140 U.S. charter schools funded by American taxpayers, as an operational and financial base to promote its global interests, said the report.
