WASHINGTON - The U.S. is set to deliver two more F-35 fighter jets to Turkey, a spokesman for the F-35 program said Tuesday. West must reject xenophobia, Islamophobia

We must shed light on all aspects of what happened, fully understand how terrorist became radicalized, says Erdogan

WASHINGTON - Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan on Tuesday urged the West to stand against racism, xenophobia and Islamophobia after a terror attack in New Zealand.

Erdogan said in the wake of the Christchurch massacre, the West has "certain responsibilities," in an article published in Washington Post newspaper.

"Western societies and governments" must reject the normalization of racism, xenophobia and Islamophobia, which has been on the rise in recent years," he said. "It is crucial to establish that such twisted ideologies, such as anti-Semitism, amount to crimes against humanity."

ANKARA - Members states of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) will convene in Turkey on Friday to discuss terror attacks in New Zealand, diplomatic sources said on Wednesday. Set for an OIC executive committee meeting on March 22, Turkey invited all the

member states to the meeting to address twin terror attacks on New Zealand mosques last Friday.

So far, 20 member states have confirmed their attendance to the meeting.

Nazarbayev: First Kazakh president

ANKARA -Kazakhstan's first President Nursultan Nazarbayev Tuesday resigned after almost three decades in

office. "I have decided to step down from the office of president," said the septuagenarian leader, who has ruled Kazakhstan since its independence in 1991, in an address which was broadcast by all

Kazakh national TV channels. Until elections for his replacement, Kassym-Zhomart Tokayev, the head of the Kazakh Senate, will carry out the presidential duties. Nazarbayev, 78, is the first Central Asian leader of the post-Soviet era to willingly leave office. In late February, Nazarbayev dismissed the country's
