'Turkey expects S-400 missiles in June'

Missile batteries most likely to be used for defense of capital Ankara, Istanbul, says Defense Minister Hulusi Akar

WASHINGTON - Turkey is expecting to receive Russian S-400 air defense batteries by June, the country's defense minister said Monday in Washington.

Speaking at the 37th annual conference of the Foreign Economic Relations Board of Turkey, Turkey-U.S. Business Council, and American-Turkish Council, Hulusi Akar said the date had been offered by Moscow in the latest meetings on the systems' delivery. Following protracted efforts to purchase an air defense system from the U.S. with no success, Ankara decided in 2017 to purchase the Russian S-400 system.

U.S. officials have advised Turkey to buy the U.S. Patriot missile system rather than the S-400s from Moscow, arguing that the Russian system would be incompatible with NATO systems and expose the F-35 to possible Russian subterfuge.

Akar underlined that the decadeslong cooperation between Ankara and Washington in military affairs as well as other fields was important and that current efforts to resolve outstanding issues between the two allies would continue.

"It will be us who solve these problems, not anybody else," Akar said, stressing that dialogue was essential.

"At times, there have been serious misunderstandings and inaccurate expressions.

"While these may sometimes occur naturally, they may also be consciously uttered to mislead," he said, adding that any detail may be critical in the decisions of policymakers. Akar said Turkey was...more details

More than 100 held in climate change protests

PARIS - A massive fire at the Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris has been extinguished after eight-and-a-half hours, a spokesman for the local fire brigade said late Monday. Firefighters will continue to ensure that the fire, which seriously damaged the iconic landmark, does not rekindle, Lt. Col. Gabriel Plus told reporters. Earlier, French President

Emmanuel Macron pledged to rebuild the cathedral.

"The worst was avoided, even if the battle has not been completely won yet, and the next few hours will be difficult," Macron told reporters after inspecting the scene.
