Turkey to US: Iran embargoes are 'wrong'

Turkey's top diplomat says Ankara expresses concern to US over trade embargo on Iran

ANKARA - Ankara will continue telling the U.S. that imposing embargoes on Iran is "wrong", Turkey's foreign minister said Wednesday. Speaking at a joint news conference with Iranian counterpart Javad Zarif, Mevlut Cavusoglu said Turkish ministers had clearly conveyed their concerns about the sanctions during a recent visit to Washington. "We will continue telling the U.S. that the embargoes [on Iran] are wrong," Cavusoglu said.

Turkey continues to work on economy and security, minister of national defense says

By Sarp Ozer WASHINGTON -Ankara expects eight partner countries of the F-35 military aircraft development project to fulfill their responsibilities, Turkey's minister of national defense said Wednesday. "As strategic partners, we

continue to work on economy Russian surface-to-air missile and security," Hulusi Akar told Anadolu Agency following a meeting with his U.S. counterpart Patrick Shanahan in Washington to discuss recent political and military developments. Akar said the U.S. has presented Turkey a new proposal on the air and missile defense systems. Tensions between the U.S. and Turkey have reached a fever pitch in recent months with Turkey set to begin receiving the advanced S-400

system that Washington said will jeopardize Turkey's role in the F-35 fighter jet program and which could trigger congressional sanctions. Turkey decided in 2017 to purchase the S-400 system following protracted efforts to purchase air defense systems from the U.S. with no success. including terrorism, adding that the stability and peace in Syria were important for Turkish border cities like Hatay. ALGIERS - A total of 105,046 residential properties were sold in Turkey last month, the Turkish Statistical Institute (TurkStat) said on Wednesday. Even though overall sales were down 5.3% in March, compared to the same period last year, sales to foreigners rose significantly. "Istanbul had the highest share of overall house sales in March at 18.2% with 19,140 units sold," TurkStat said. Melih Tavukcuoglu, head of the Contractors' Association on Istanbul's Asian side, said the country will close 2019 with a slightly less number of sales compared to the last year.
