Twitter post shows Israel destroyed Turkish news agency's office in Gaza deliberately, not by accident

ANKARA - A list of Israeli airstrike targets posted on Twitter proves that Israel's destruction of Anadolu Agency's office in Gaza on Saturday was deliberate, according to a top agency official. Israel had a "retaliation list" on hand before its attacks on Gaza and knew it was bombing the offices of a media organization, said Mustafa Ozkaya, Anadolu Agency's deputy director,

on Sunday.

"The list mentions destroying the Anadolu Agency building. It is a confession that they targeted us deliberately, not by mistake," said Ozkaya.

"Bombing Anadolu Agency is also proof of the level of destruction they have in mind for Gaza," added Ozkaya. "Anadolu Agency will continue to tell the world about Gaza." The Twitter account Israel News Feed on... MORE DETAILS

41 killed in Russia plane hard landing

MOSCOW - Up to 41 people were killed after a Russian Aeroflot plane made an emergency landing in Moscow's Sheremetyevo airport, **Russian Investigative** Committee said late Sunday.

A Superjet-100 plane with 78 people on-board, traveling from Moscow to the northern port city of Murmansk, caught fire soon after taking off and asked for an emergency landing, the Committee's spokeswoman Svetlana Petrenko told reporters in MOSCOW. MORE DETAILS

ANKARA - Turkey increased its electricity production from local and renewables sources in the first quarter of 2019 to 62% compared to 48.5% during the same period of last year, according to data from the Energy and Natural Resources Ministry on Monday.

Turkey produced 74.25 billion kilowatt-hours of electricity in the first quarter of this year, of which 46.11

billion came from local and renewable energy resources. The biggest share of these resources came from hydroelectric power plants at 30.41%, a significant rise from the 19.18% share in the first quarter of 2018. In total production, local coal realized 16.22%, wind produced 8.33%, 3.04% came from geothermal sources, and solar, biomass and energy resources held a ... MORE DETAILS
