LONDON - More than two dozen religious sites including mosques in China's northwestern Xinjiang province have been partly or completely demolished since 2016, a British daily claimed Tuesday. Ebola death toll in DR Congo rises to 979

DAKAR - The death toll from the contagious Ebola virus in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) has risen to 979 since the start of an outbreak last July, according to an official statement on Tuesday.
