ADANA - Turkish prosecutors issued arrest warrants for 56 people with suspected links to the Fetullah Terrorist Organization/Parallel State Structure (FETO/PDY), the group behind the 2016 defeated coup, judicial sources said Tuesday. Prosecutors in Turkey's

southern province of Adana issued the warrants as part of a probe of the new training structure of FETO/PDY, according to sources who asked not to be named due to restrictions on speaking to the media.
